Short description/Contents	This academic discipline is designed to equip students with the skills necessary to develop, implement, and evaluate projects funded by European sources. To this end, the course objectives include elucidating the various phases involved in the development of European-funded projects, employing specific tools for the formulation and execution of these projects, and assessing the viability of management decisions within the context of European project management. Additionally, the course encourages critical analysis of particular project management decisions and the formulation of alternative solutions, thereby fostering a comprehensive understanding of effective project management practices in a European context.
Assessment/Evaluation	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Essay (25%): The essay component accounts for 25% of the overall assessment. Students are expected to engage in critical analysis and articulate their arguments coherently while demonstrating a comprehensive understanding of the subject matter.2. Case Study (25%): This section constitutes another 25% of the total assessment. It requires students to apply theoretical concepts to real-world scenarios, showcasing their ability to analyze and synthesize information effectively.3. Project (50%): The project represents the most substantial portion of the assessment, accounting for 50% of the total mark. This is further divided into two components:<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Written Component (25%): Students will be tasked with producing a substantial written report that demonstrates rigorous research and a clear presentation of findings.- Presentation Component (25%): In addition to the written report, students must present their project findings to an audience, effectively conveying their research insights and engaging in
