Students are expected to engage in critical analysis and articulate their arguments coherently while demonstrating a comprehensive understanding of the subject matter.2. Case Study (25%): This section constitutes another 25% of the total assessment. It requires students to apply theoretical concepts to real-world scenarios, showcasing their ability to analyze and synthesize information effectively.3. Project (50%): The project represents the most substantial portion of the assessment, accounting for 50% of the total mark. This is further divided into two components:<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Written Component (25%): Students will be tasked with producing a substantial written report that demonstrates rigorous research and a clear presentation of findings.- Presentation Component (25%): In addition to the written report, students must present their project findings to an audience, effectively conveying their research insights and engaging in discussion to demonstrate their mastery of the material.



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	This structured approach of the Project not only assesses theoretical knowledge but also emphasizes practical application, research skills, and effective communication.
